

# ***Results of the ABBPG Neighborhood Survey.... Or “What Positions Should ABBPG Take on Behalf of the Community”?***



We included a four-page survey in each November issue of the Peninsula Pelican which was distributed to all Peninsula residents. We have received and tabulated the results of the 151 surveys returned below for your information. We wish to thank those residents who took the time to complete the document and return it. This is the only way that the Board of Directors of ABBPG can truly be sure it represents the interests of the majority of the residents. Individual requests, comments and/or complaints are just that-- individual. The comments on the surveys reflected a wide range of opinions on various topics. They will serve as valuable resources for the development of next year's survey, so that we can test to see how the majority of the community wishes to be represented. If you missed your opportunity to respond, we look to your input on the next community survey.

Below the question on the survey is restated with the percentage responding Yes, No and No Opinion listed. In some cases the numbers do not add up to 100% as some respondents did not answer all questions.

## **SAFETY**

**Do you believe the law enforcement presence on the Peninsula should be increased?**

*Yes – 64%                      No – 16%                      No Opinion – 17%*

**Are you aware of the on-going criminal activity at the 72<sup>nd</sup> Place parking lots and jetty?**

*Yes – 65%                      No – 32%                      No Opinion – 4%*

**Would you be interested in participating in a Neighborhood Watch program on the Peninsula?**

*Yes -- 30                      No – 50*

## **GENERAL & IMPROVEMENT ISSUES**

**Should the ABBPG take positions before the City on issues affecting the Peninsula?**

*(example: filming permits)*

*Yes – 83%                      No – 13%                      No Opinion – 3%*

**Should the ABBPG take positions on City-wide issues not directly connected to the Peninsula?**

*(example: Home Depot project on Studebaker at Loynes)*

*Yes – 36%                      No – 53%                      No Opinion – 8%*

## **ZONING**

Based on earlier surveys, the ABBPG currently opposes building variances on the Peninsula before the City relative to height and parking and set-backs.

**Should the ABBPG continue to actively take a position opposing such variances?**

*Yes – 72%                      No – 23%                      No Opinion – 3%*

**Should the ABBPG actively oppose building variances in addition to those involving height and parking, and setbacks?**

*Yes – 48%                      No – 34%                      No Opinion – 13%*

**Should the ABBPG notify the City if it becomes aware of “illegal” rental units?**

*Yes – 62%                      No – 25%                      No Opinion – 10%*

**Should the ABBPG notify the City on issues of “garage enforcement”?**

*Yes – 55%                      No – 31%                      No Opinion – 9%*

## **TRAFFIC**

**Do you believe speeding cars on Ocean Boulevard remain a problem?**

*Yes – 70%                      No – 21%                      No Opinion – 5%*

**Would you support the installation of additional STOP signs between 54<sup>th</sup> and 72<sup>nd</sup> Place to reduce speeding?**

*Yes – 42%                      No – 50%                      No Opinion – 4%*

**Do you believe any additional types of mechanisms, e.g., speed bumps, are necessary to ensure drivers on Ocean Boulevard proceed at a safe speed?**

*Yes – 32%                      No – 46%                      No Opinion – 4%*
