COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT and COMMUNITY INTEREST

MEDIAN MAINTENANCE: Ken Herbage from the Parks, Recreation and Marine Department has helped get some large boulders moved from other parts of the beach to the end of the Median at 72nd. These will further deter trucks and boat trailers from running over the median plants, sprinklers and lighting. **Midori Gardens** one of the City's maintenance contractors has been busy trimming the gazanias and pulling out other plants on the medians. The sick looking palms are being fed! All the City palms were trimmed in our areas! Some of the dead and dying plants have been replaced and others are scheduled for replacement. **Tom Shippey and Shawn Larson** have been instrumental in helping with these items. The **Facility Division** has replaced all the burned out bulbs on the median lighting. Things are looking good for all of us!

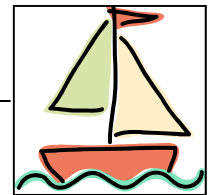
UNDERGROUNDING UTILITY PROJECT: In these past weeks we had an intensive meeting about this Project. This meeting was attended by Public Works, the City Manager, all the Utility Groups for Long Beach, our City Councilman Gary DeLong, representatives for the Naples Improvement Association (Shan Haq), a private underground utility engineer, and a few other movers and shakers. In the meeting a decision was reached to move forward with an

“interest only” ballot to poll the interest of the residents in such a project. The ballots will be passed out by both the NIA and the ABBPG in their respective neighborhoods. To prepare the ballot an independent engineer will be engaged to do an assessment and research study on similar underground projects in nearby communities. With this study a realistic first pass estimated cost per house can be included on the interest ballot. The City is going to pay 50% of the engineer's fees for this study. The other 50% is being paid in equal shares by the ABBPG and the NIA. We are confident that the engineer's study will produce an credible accurate estimate which may be included in the interest only ballot by this fall, and that the results can be discussed at the October Community Meeting.

TRASH CANS: Trash cans have been added where needed and will continue to be added where they are needed throughout the summer. They are being checked frequently and emptied on a regular basis.

STREET END SIGNS: Have been added where none existed to inform beachgoers about the restrictions on our beaches. Police enforced these rules on the **4TH of JULY** as well as now and are paying particular attention to minors drinking on the beach!

BEACH & BAY NOTES:

1. Based on the City study of water flow in various places in the Bay, a direct correlation has been established between water quality and pumping at the power plants. When pumping is reduced, water quality goes down. The city is studying plans retain pump circulation when power production is limited.
2. Design work will start soon for repair of the cracked seawall at 61st Place and Bay Shore.
3. Completion of the Army Corps of Engineers study of options to reduce ocean beach erosion has been delayed by three months.
4. Rebuilding of the Alamitos Bay Marina is scheduled to start before the end of 2007. The Leeway Sailing Club building will be enlarged during its upcoming rebuild.

Security

LBPD is vigorously enforcing the 10 PM curfew sweeps for those under 18 years of age. The citation will cost \$200.

Due to the increase in elder abuse, financial, verbal and physical, LBPD has created a section within the department (Senior Police Partners) similar to that for child abuse with its own hotline – 570-7208. An instance was reported in which an unscrupulous care giver convinced an elderly woman to give him her power of attorney and named himself as beneficiary of all her estate.

PD is enforcing the ban on bar-b-ques and open fires on the beach and in parks.

The Security Committee has requested a meeting with councilman DeLong and the new Commander of the East Division, Cynthia Renaud, to request more PD presence at the east end of the Peninsula and to help reduce the serious speeding problem on Ocean. We will have a report on this meeting in the next Pelican. All of the Peninsula residents who have reported to us on July 4th events have been complimentary of the PD traffic stop at 54th Place and walking patrol officers on Bay Shore and Seaside Walks and credit those actions with a greatly reduced incidence of minor drinking and other disorderly activities.

If you have security concerns, please contact PD and or the Council office or you can contact us by dropping a note in the ABBPG box in the laundry on 62nd Place.

Message from the CERT Team

HELP US TO HELP YOU

The Peninsula CERT team needs your help. We are asking all residents to fill out the enclosed questionnaire so we can prepare a more effective disaster response. We are gathering this information for two reasons: (1) To inventory specific resources and personnel that may be useful in a large scale emergency and (2) To identify households that may require special or additional assistance because of medical condition, advanced age, limited mobility, etc. Please note that any information you provide will only be used by CERT team leaders or authorized rescue personnel in the event of an emergency. Your neighbors on the CERT team will try to do everything we can to help you and your family through an emergency should one arise. The more information we have, the easier that will be. This form can be a crucial part of your family's disaster preparedness and it only takes a few moments to complete. Thank you for your cooperation.

The completed form can be mailed to the ABBPG at PO Box 3535, Long Beach, CA 90803 or may be dropped off at the ABBPG drop box located at the Bay Wash Laundromat at 49-62nd Place.

Water quality in Alamitos Bay and the Ocean Beachside along the Peninsula.

The Long Beach Health Department regularly posts water testing results from several sampling locations around the Peninsula, both beachside and in the bay. Results are available by telephone at the **Beach Advisory and Closure Hotline at (562) 570-4199** and are also posted on the **Long Beach City Health Department website**. This site may be reached by going to www.longbeach.gov, clicking then on the City Services tab, scrolling to the Health item, which will open the Health page. From here hit Recreational Water Monitoring and it will take you directly to current water samples posting. As of this writing (July 11) there is posted on the website (and press releases) a LA City Sanitation sewage spill which occurred around July 10th in the San Pedro and LA Harbor area. Due to historic water currents, there is a potential that the City's recreational waters may be impacted. Therefore the Long Beach Health Officer, Dr. Helene Calvet, has ordered Beach Advisories posted on the city's coastal beaches. As of this writing most of the Peninsula areas impacted are on the Beachside and not in Alamitos Bay. However, as a caution, the hotline or website should be consulted for exact status and locations.
